Signed into law on July 31, 2018, The Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act, or Perkins V, provides learners with the opportunity to cultivate skills in various career and technical education (CTE) fields.

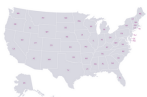
